Dairy Farmer

- · Responsibilities: feeding; maintenance; paying bills and employees
- Education: dairy work experience; bachelor's degree in ag business or animal science
- Pay: \$21.62/hour

Grocery Store Associate Employee

- Responsibilities: stocking the refrigeration shelves and dry shelves; checking out customers
- Education: not required
- Pay: \$15.50/hour

Milker

- Responsibilities: milking all the cows on the dairy and making sure they are healthy; keeping the milk parlor clean and sanitized
