### **Pre-Instruction**

Download Dairy Council of California curriculum and resources from our website Online Learning. Here are some ways that you can adapt the curriculum and resources for online use.

#### Splitting PDF Pages (if you only need a part of the PDF file)

Windows

- 1. Open PDF file in Adobe Acrobat Reader
- 2. Go to Printer (drop-down box) > Select Microsoft Print to PDF
- 3. Enter the pages you want to split
- 4. Click Print > Title and save new PDF document

#### macOS

- 1. Open PDF file in Preview.
- 2. Click View > Thumbnails
- 4. Drag and drop the selected pages to your desktop

## Turning PDF page to image file (.PNG)

- 1. Open PDF file
- 2. Options:
  - a. Windows PC

Press Windows key > Type snipping tool > Press Enter > Click New > Drag to screenshot worksheet > Save

b. macOS

Press Shift+#+5 > Drag to screenshot worksheet > Click Capture

## Google, Schoology

Turning PDF page to editable worksheet

- 1. Open PDF file
- 2. Options:
  - c. Windows PC

Press Windows key > Type snipping tool > Press Enter > Click New > Drag to screenshot worksheet > Save

d. macOS

Press Shift+#+5 > Drag to screenshot worksheet > Click Capture

- 3. Open Google Drive
- 4. Click New > Google Slides
- 5. Delete default boxes on initial slide





- Click File > Page setup > Custom (8.5 x 11 or 11 x 8.5 depending on page orientation) > Apply
- Right-click on slide > Change background > Choose image file of worksheet > Upload browse or drag file > Click Done

(Doing this helps keep the worksheet in place and prevents students from deleting or moving it around)

- 8. Options:
  - a. Add textboxes with text i.e. "Type your answers here." on areas where you want students to type
  - b. Students create their own textboxes
- 9. When sharing the file to students, make sure to "Make a Copy" (*This ensures that no changes are made to the master copy*)

## ClassDojo

- 1. Open your class
- 2. Click on Portfolios > Create Activity
- 3. Add activity name and instructions > Choose Response type: Text, Video, Photo, Drawing, Worksheet
- 4. Select students to assign (whole class or individual)

#### Seesaw

- 1. Open SeeSaw
- 2. Click Add (large green circle) > Assign Activity
- 3. Select Create New Activity > Add activity name and instructions
- 4. Click Add Template for Student Responses > Upload images, files, etc. > Click the green checkmark (top right corner)
- 5. Review title, instructions > Click Save
- 6. Select students to assign (class or individual)





### In-Class Instruction

Tips and tricks during instruction

- Use the Instructional Sequence in the educator guide and tailor it to what will work for you and your students.
- Share pages from the student workbook, videos, and games with your students. If short
  on time, pre-record nutrition lessons for the students to view on their own and continue
  the discussion via tools like Zoom, Flipgrid, and Padlet.
- Assign in-class activities as student projects—give them different options on how they
  would like to present it (writing, video, drawing, etc.)
- Share Family Connection letters and videos with families

#### **Zoom**

Share document, website, video, etc. to view by sharing your screen

- 1. Click **Share Screen** in your Zoom meeting toolbar
- 2. Choose a screen share option
  - a. Check **Share Computer Sound** to share sound played by your computer.
  - b. Check **Optimize for full screen video clip** if you are sharing a video clip in full screen mode.
- 3. Click Share

Sharing a whiteboard (if annotation is allowed)

- 1. Click **Share Screen** in your Zoom meeting toolbar
- 2. Choose Whiteboard option annotation tools will pop up

Breakout rooms for live pair-share or small/whole group discussions

#### **Fliparid**

Use Flipgrid to facilitate discussion through videos. Post topics, questions, etc. and have students post their responses. Teachers can reply to students with video or text and allow students to reply to other students' responses.

#### **Padlet**

Create Know/Want to Know/Learned (K/W/L) charts, interactive discussion, student research, student/family learning portfolios
