Santa Barbara County School Wellness Summit Let's Eat Healthy Community Grants

Overview

Santa Barbara County School Wellness Summit and Dairy Council of California are teaming up to advance the health and well-being of schools and communities by awarding three community grants in 2023. This funding program advances innovative, collaborative solutions to foster healthy eating through the Let's Eat Healthy Initiative.

Criteria

- Proposals must be consistent with the values of <u>Let's Eat Healthy</u> and align to at least one Let's Eat Healthy <u>Strategic Framework</u> goal and objective.
- Projects must address at least one of the following focus areas:
 - Advance nutrition security by increasing access to healthy, wholesome foods, including milk and dairy foods
 - o Advance equitable access to science-based nutrition education
 - Enhance food and agricultural literacy that encompasses the role of dairy in local sustainable food systems
- Applicants must target communities in one or more of the following regions: Santa Barbara County, San Luis Obispo County, Ventura County.
- Projects must be implemented and evaluated by June 30, 2024.

Eligibility

- Applicants must represent an entity in California (school, district, nonprofit/community organization, etc.).
- Applicants must be registered members of Let's Eat Healthy. Register to join and commit to building healthier communities <u>here</u>.
- If awarded a grant, the grantees or their designees must be available to present a brief overview of the funded project at the 10th annual <u>Santa Barbara County School</u> <u>Wellness Summit</u> on October 4, 2023.

Selection Process

- Completed <u>online applications</u> must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. PDT, Monday, September 4, 2023.
- All applications will undergo external review.
- Applicants will be notified via email by the week of September 25, 2023.
- Santa Barbara Foundation c/o Santa Barbara County School Wellness Summit will manage funding disbursement, and accepted proposals will receive payment by October 31, 2023.
- Awardees will be announced at the Santa Barbara County School Wellness Summit on October 4, 2023, and they will give a brief overview of their projects.

Funding Availability

- \$15,000 total is available to be awarded in partnership with Santa Barbara County School Wellness Summit.
- Three grants valued up to \$5,000 will be awarded.

- If awarded funds, the school/district/organization must comply with all reporting requirements, including progress check-ins and submission of midterm and final reports documenting the use and impact of the funds.
- Projects must be implemented and evaluated by June 30, 2024.
- Failure to comply with the reporting requirements may prohibit a school/district/organization from receiving future funds.
- Grant recipients are committing to acknowledge partnership with Santa Barbara County School Wellness Summit and Let's Eat Healthy.

Funding Restrictions

Funding <u>may not</u> be used for any of the following purposes:

- To influence legislation or influence the outcome of any public election.
- To carry on, directly or indirectly, any voter registration drive.
- To make any grant to any other individual or organization.
- To undertake activities not supported within the grant scope of work. Any changes to the use of funding must first be reviewed and approved by Santa Barbara County School Wellness Summit/Dairy Council of California.
- To pay for food sold at school to students, or to subsidize food or the cost of meals served to students in school meal programs.
- To purchase computers or other general tech equipment. (Technology requests must be supported with a strong case that it is central or essential to the proposed project.)
